

College Act 2023

An Act to define the statutory powers of the Royal College of Elmwycke and its members, and to define the proceedings of the Royal College of Elmwycke.

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Schedule 1: The Royal College of Elmwycke

- 1. There shall be a Royal College of Elmwycke to act as its legislature.
- 2. Two members of the Royal College shall be returned for each constituency at an election held in the constituency, under the Single Transferrable Vote system.
- 3. The validity of any proceedings of the Royal College is not affected by any vacancy in its membership.

Schedule 2: Ordinary Elections

- 1. An election for each constituency shall be held on, or within 7 days of, the 6th of June every year.
- 2. If this is not possible, the date of the election shall be decided by the Royal College of Elmwycke.
- 3. The Royal College of Elmwycke must dissolve on the 31st of May of each year, and may only meet if either:
 - a. The date of the election for one or more constituencies must be moved, or if;
 - b. All members of the Royal College have been elected.

Schedule 3: Extraordinary Elections

- 1. Should a Member of the Royal College resign or be expelled, a byelection must be called within 14 days in their constituency to replace them.
- 2. Extraordinary elections should use the Supplementary Vote system.
- 3. Extraordinary elections do not affect the date of ordinary elections to the Royal College.

Schedule 4: Candidates

- 1. At a general election, candidates may stand for return as members of a constituency.
- 2. A person may not stand as a candidate for return in more than one constituency.
- 3. A person may not stand for return as a candidate for return if they have been expelled from the Royal College of Elmwycke within the past 24 months.
- 4. A person may not stand for return as a candidate in an extra-ordinary election if they already sit in the Royal College of Elmwycke.

Schedule 5: Electors

- 1. Electors for the Royal College of Elmwycke must have;
 - a. surpassed the age of 13;
 - b. not been convicted of electoral fraud, and;
 - c. been registered on the electoral roll
- 2. Electors for the Royal College of Elmwycke must not vote in more than one constituency.
- 3. Electors may not change their ballot after they have voted.

Schedule 6: Membership

- 1. The term of office for Members of the Royal College starts immediately when elected, and ends when the Royal College dissolves.
- 2. Members of the Royal College may resign from their positions before their term ends.
- 3. A person is disqualified from being a Member of the Royal College if;
 - a. They do not hold citizenship of Elmwycke, or if;
 - b. They have been expelled from the Royal College, or if;
 - c. They are a non-residing citizen of Elmwycke
- 4. The Royal College may vote to disregard a disqualification of a person from being a Member of the Royal College.
- 5. The Royal College may vote to expel a Member, and if the vote is passed, then:
 - a. The Member's seat will become vacant, and;
 - b. Any titles held by the Member will be revoked by the Speaker
 - c. The Member will remain until their seat's vacancy is filled, but;
 - i. They shall not be able to vote in the Royal College
 - ii. They shall not be able to speak in the Royal College
- 6. Any Member expelled by the Royal College may appeal directly to the Royal College or to the Supreme Court

Schedule 7: Speaker of the Royal College

- 1. The Speaker of the Royal College is the head of state of Elmwycke.
- 2. The Speaker of the Royal College holds the title for life or until resignation.
- 3. If the Speaker of the Royal College's seat becomes vacant, then:
 - a. The longest-serving member of the Royal College becomes Speaker until a new Speaker is elected.
 - b. There will be an election within the Royal College to determine a new Speaker.
 - i. This election will use the Supplementary Vote system.
 - ii. Only Members of the Royal College may stand for return in this election.
 - iii. Only Members of the Royal College may stand as electors in this election.
 - iv. The elected Member's seat shall become vacant.
- 4. The Speaker of the Royal College must give assent to any legislation.
- 5. The Speaker of the Royal College chairs College sessions.
- 6. The Speaker of the Royal College has the ability to vote in order to break a tie, and to speak during College sessions.

Schedule 8: Proceedings

- 1. The Royal College may solely make, unmake or amend laws with a simple majority vote.
- 2. Legislation presented to the Royal College must go through three stages.
 - a. The first stage is an initial reading, by the Member who has presented it.
 - b. The second stage is revision, where the legislation is scrutinised by the Royal College
 - c. The third stage is the final vote on legislation.
- 3. Legislation presented to the Royal College must be entered into the National Library of Elmwycke.

Schedule 9: The Royal Government

- 1. Departments of Government can be created and removed at the sole discretion of the Speaker of the Royal College.
- 2. Secretaries of State may be appointed and removed at the sole discretion of the Speaker of the Royal College.
- 3. Under-Secretaries may be appointed by Secretaries of State.
- 4. The Royal Government of Elmwycke shall act as a collective authority, and shall have collective responsibility for the Departments of the Royal Government of Elmwycke.

Schedule 10: Miscellaneous

- 1. The National Library of Elmwycke is to be a permanent department, exempt from the singular veto powers of the Speaker of the Royal College, and can only be dissolved by an Act of the Royal College.
- 2. The National Library of Elmwycke is to be administered by the Speaker of the Royal College.
- 3. All those speaking in the Royal College of Elmwycke must swear an affirmation of truth.
- 4. The Royal College of Elmwycke is granted its own flag, which must only be presented alongside, or below, the national flag of Elmwycke.
- 5. Upon affirmation of this Act, the Constitution of Elmwycke will be considered null and void.
